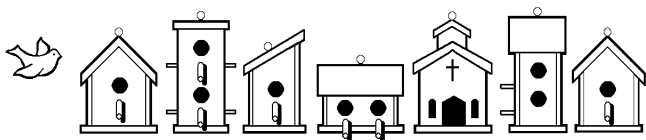

Dear colleagues and friends,

We are doing fine with our first Easter here. It was quite different and I missed our celebration of Holy Week and Easter that I was used to while I was in the parish. Such is the way it is living in a culture so different from your own. I have started to do some work in the Finance Office here on Ampo and can begin to see a sense of how that might play out during our time here. It was be challenging. I will be working closely with a German missionary who is the church controller along with a fine young PNG man, Gavin who will be my PNG counterpart. Developing those relationships is among the most important work I may do here, along with the many other friendships and relationships that are yet to be formed.

We still are having VISA problems and don't yet have our permanent PNG Visa. We spent 6 weeks in Brisbane, Australia waiting for VISAs only to not get them. We had to return to PNG on Feb 28 with another 60-day temporary visa and will have to go back again to Australia on April 26 and try again. Such is the way it is here in PNG. Institutions, be they government, churches, schools, hospitals and business just don't work like we expect them to in the US. Such is life in an undeveloped country. Patience is a virtue that we really have to perfect here, which isn't all bad.
